Anderson Peynetsa was born to Charles and Wilma Peynetsa of Zuni Pueblo in 1964. Like his sisters Agnes and Priscilla, Anderson learned to make pottery the traditional way when he took Jennie Laate's class at Zuni High School. He's been making pottery ever since, participating in shows at the Tucson Fine Arts Museum, the Heard Museum in Phoenix and at the SWAIA Santa Fe Indian Market.

Anderson's favorite styles are the water jar and the duck pot. His favorite designs are traditional Zuni patterns plus deer with heart line and geometric designs. He says he gets his inspiration from seeing what others are doing in the art, pottery and jewelry worlds at Zuni Pueblo.

Anderson also says he was inspired by Jennie Laate to help rebuild the legacy of pottery making at Zuni Pueblo and he's always surprised at the impact he has had on the pueblo. And he always recommends learning to make pottery the traditional way, especially for the meditational and healing aspects of the process.
